CLUB SAFETY POLICY



Warrington Rowing Club regards the promotion of health and safety as a mutual objective for the Club's Officers & Committee and its members. It is therefore the policy of the management to do all that is reasonably practicable, to provide a safe and healthy environment for all its members, any visitors and the general public from foreseeable hazards arising from the club's activities.

The management team will meet this responsibility by providing and maintaining –

- 1) buildings, equipment and systems of operation that are safe,
- 2) sufficient supervision, instruction, training and information,
- 3) arrangements for dealing with health and welfare,
- 4) systems for recording and investigating any incidents involving club members,

and will bring this statement, together with any revisions, to the attention of all club members.

All club members have a primary responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others who may be affected by their acts or omissions. The Club Safety Adviser is appointed as the nominated person to oversee the Club Safety Policy.

While on the club property or on the water, club members must –

- 1) take care of the health and safety of themselves, their fellow club members and anyone else on the club property,
- 2) comply with the WRC Safety Plan (posted on the Safety Notice Board),
- 3) comply with instructions given by the Club's Officers or their Coach,
- 4) report any incidents to their Coach, Club Safety Adviser or a Club Officer.
